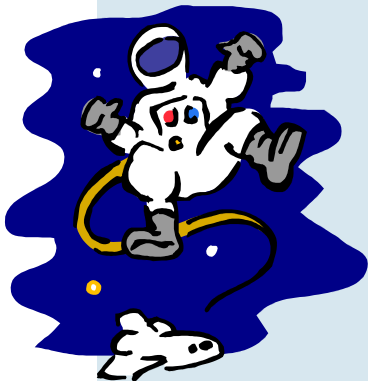


Is Your Child a “Small Scientist?”

Enroll your child in a “Small Scientists” class today!

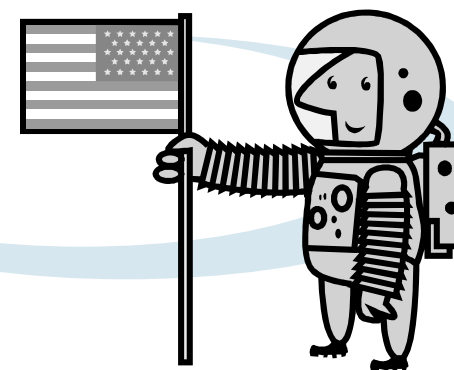

In Space Nobody Can Hear You Play: Ages 2-3

This program is designed to introduce your little one to the wonders of space. Children will listen to a story about traveling to the moon, followed by games and hands on activities that are designed specifically for younger children. Children will also meet and interact with the IWASM Kids Club mascot and resident aviatrix, Paige Penguin.

Making Faces...On the Moon: Ages 3-4

The moon is one of the first objects in the night sky your child will recognize. Children will listen to the Japanese folklore about the Rabbit in the Moon and will identify shapes that they see on the moon's surface. In

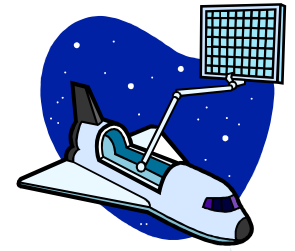

Lunar Landings: Ages 5-6

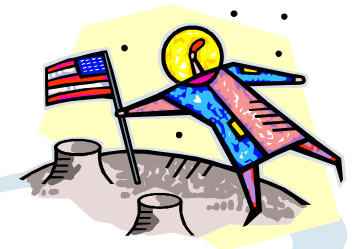
This program teaches your child about astronauts and the lunar landing. Children will listen to a story about astronaut's voyage to
